INTRODUCTION

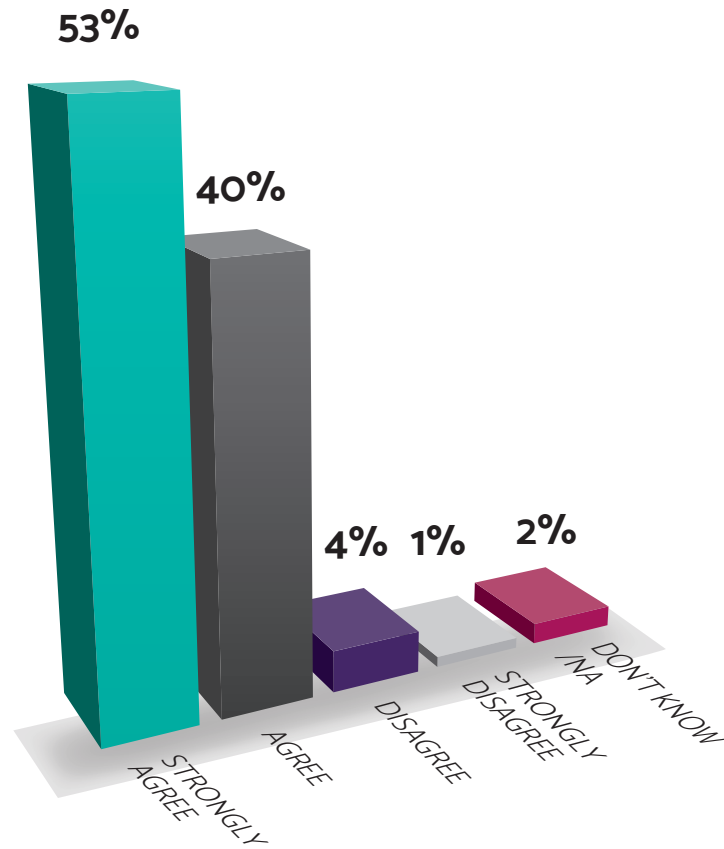
Premier Christian Communications recently carried out a national survey revealing what it really means to be an ordinary Christian in Britain today.

More than twelve thousand people took part in the survey and the results are stark. It's clear to me that we are not the liberal accepting society we think we are if we can't tolerate and accept everyone, including Christians. People of faith, from all religions, should be allowed to live and work in freedom. They should be encouraged to hold to their faith not just in their homes and churches, mosques, synagogues and temples, but also in their jobs and hobbies and in the public square. This survey clearly indicates how it feels to be an ordinary Christian today, and I suspect other faith groups may have similar stories to tell.

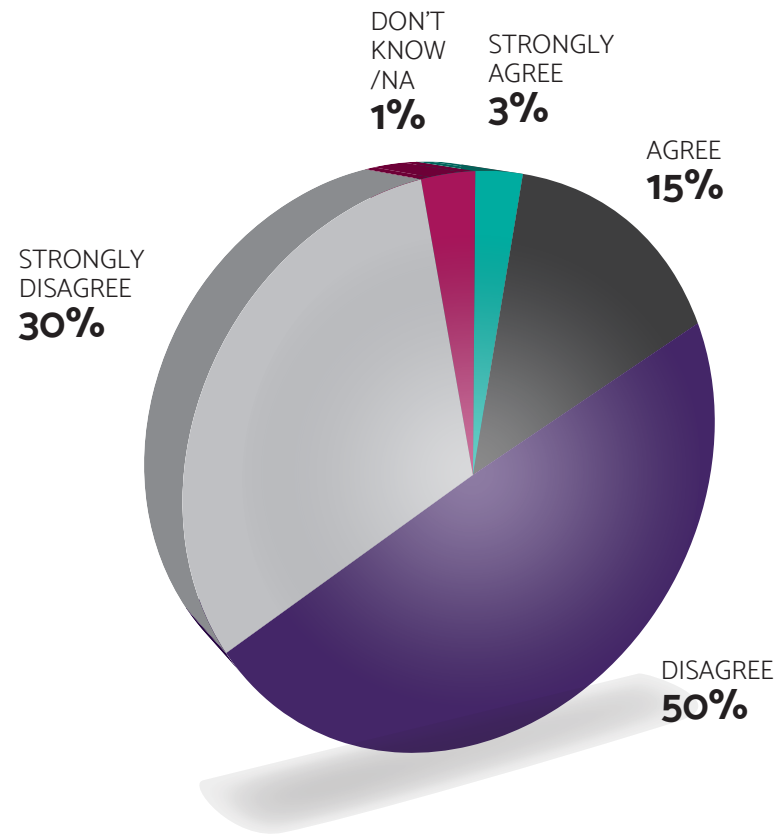

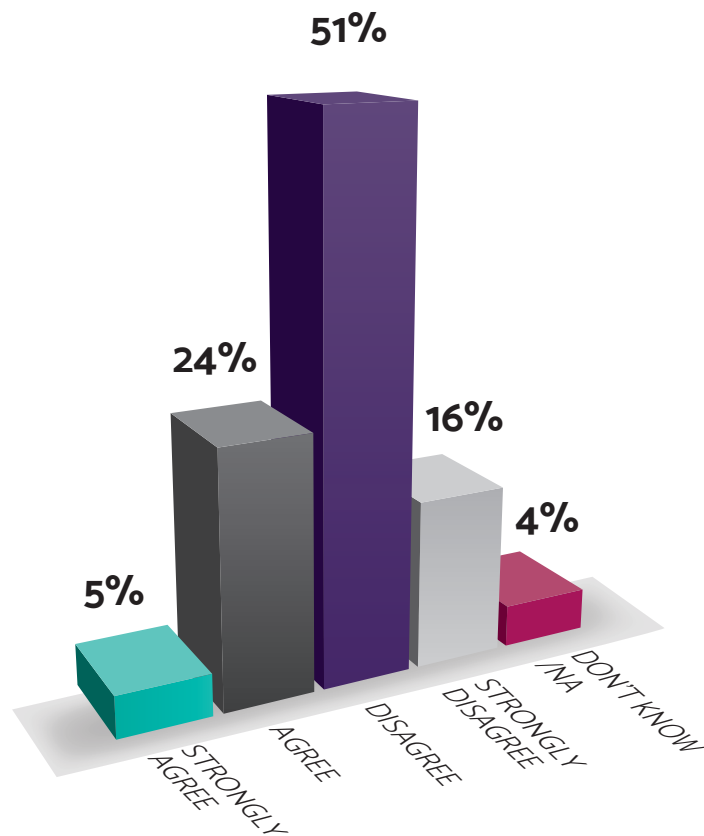
CHRISTIANITY IS BEING MARGINALISED IN SOCIETY



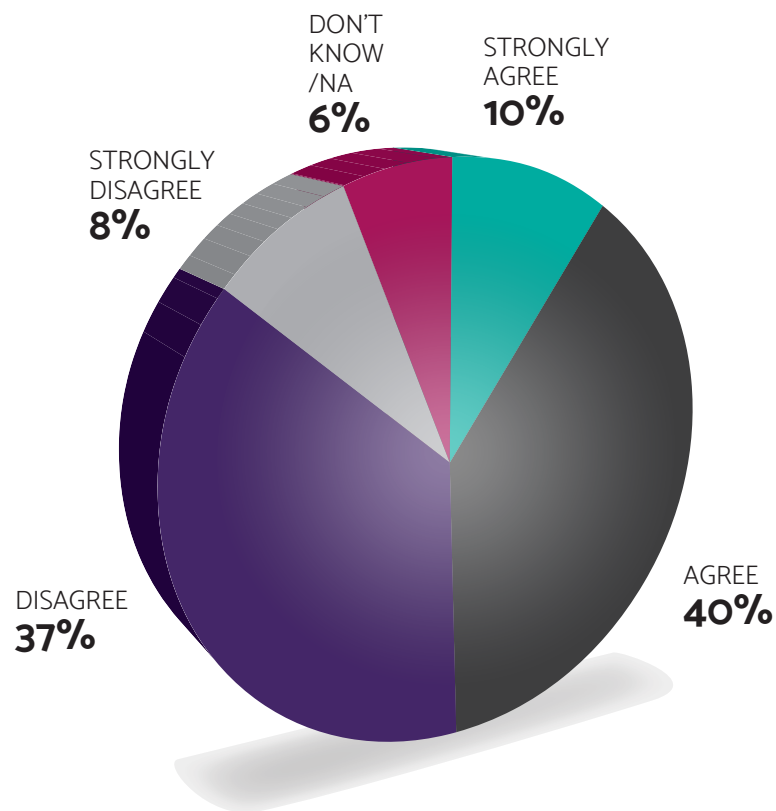
CHRISTIANITY IS GIVEN THE SAME RESPECT IN SOCIETY AS OTHER WORLDVIEWS AND RELIGIONS



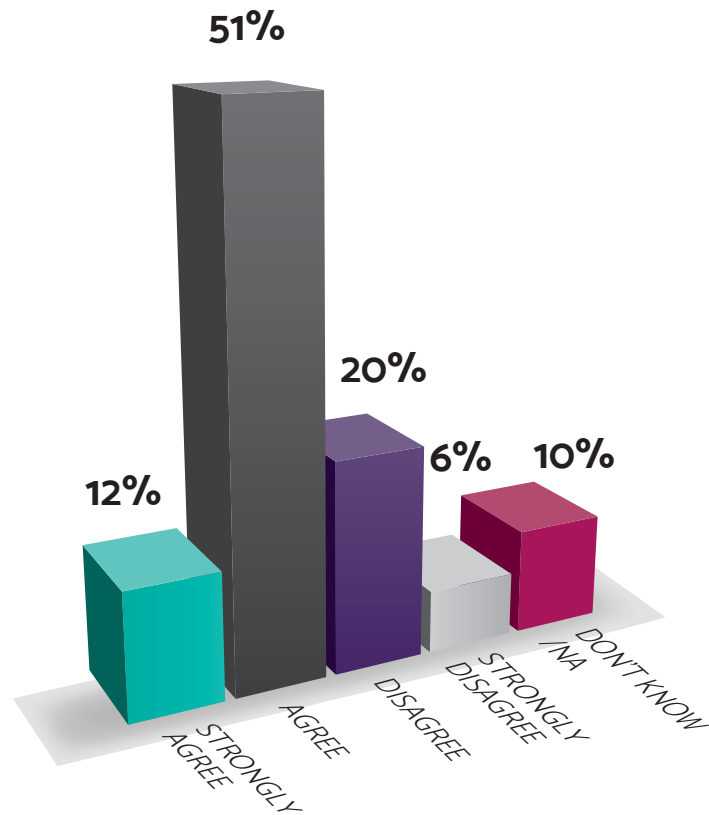

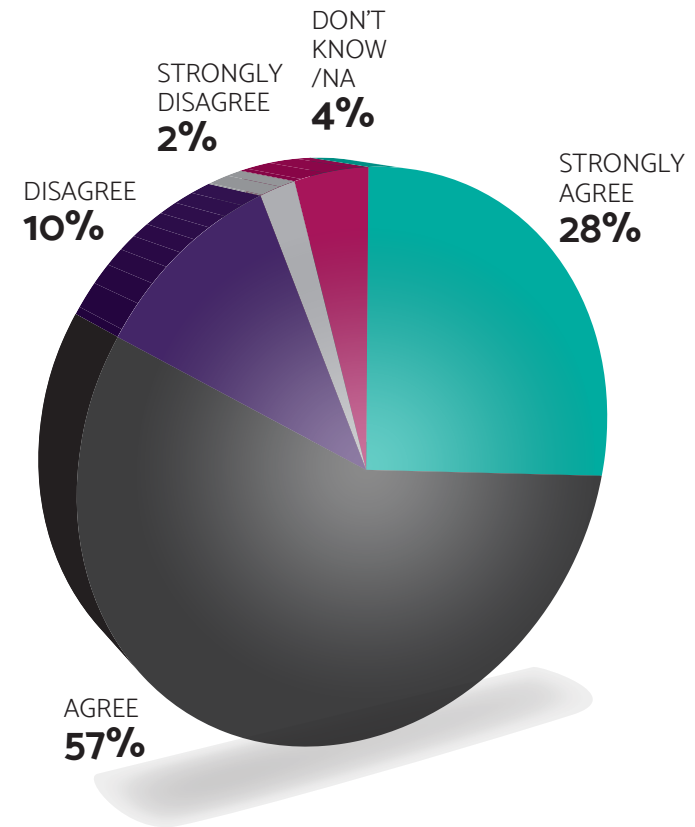
I HAVE PERSONALLY EXPERIENCED PREJUDICE AGAINST MY FAITH



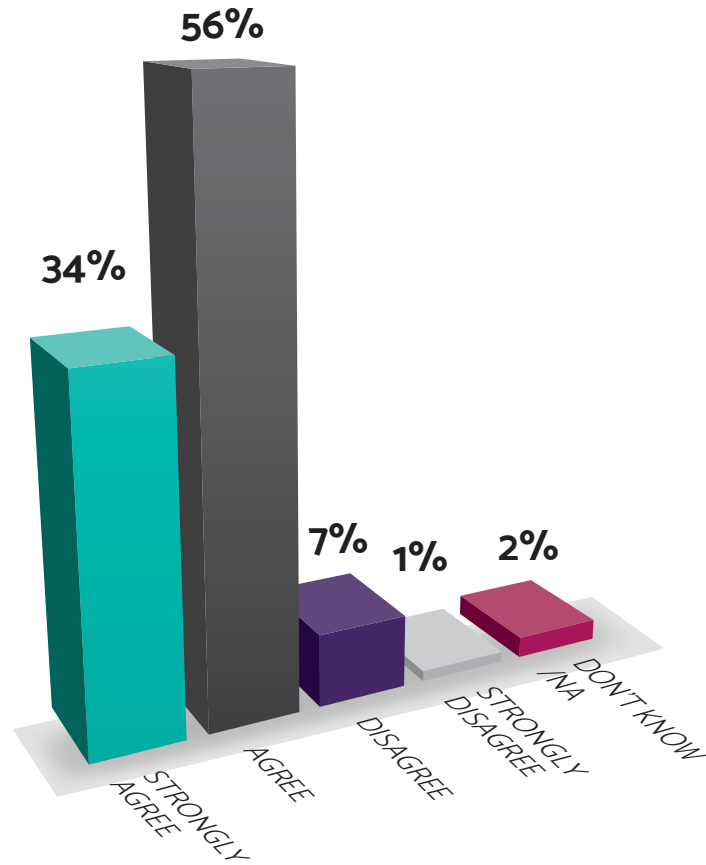
I AM ABLE TO BE OPEN ABOUT MY PERSONAL FAITH IN MY WORKPLACE OR EQUIVALENT SETTING



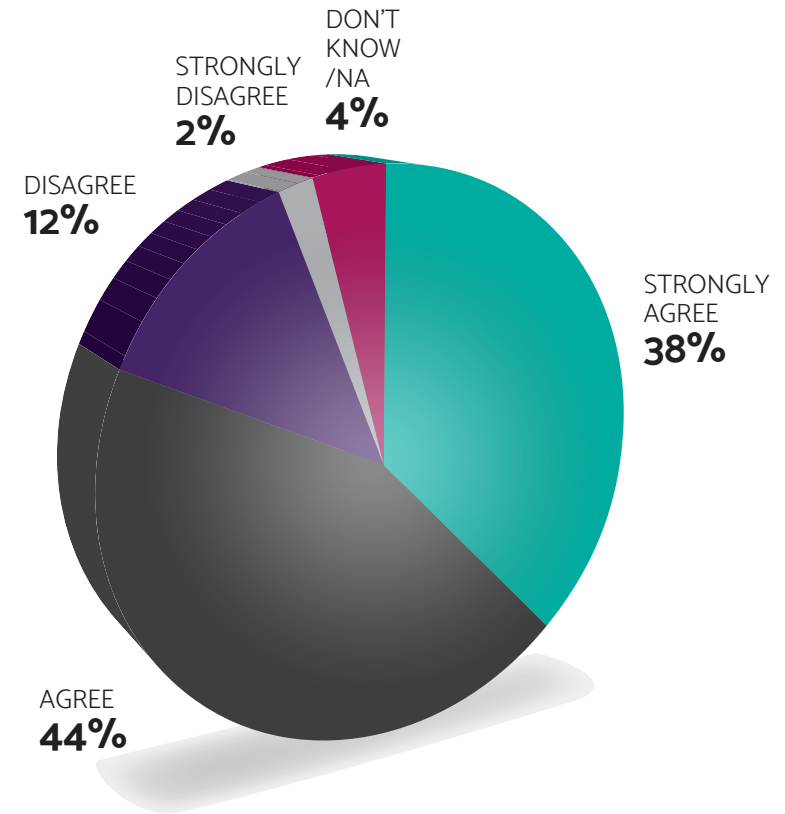
