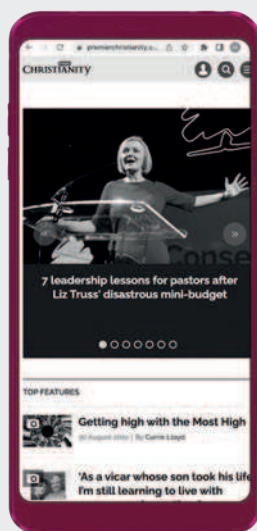

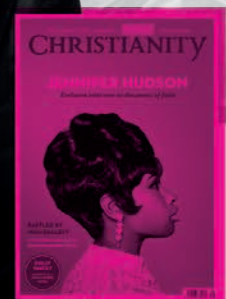

Season 3 of **The Big Conversation** launched in April 2021, presenting popular episodes including Bishop Robert Barron debating the existence of God with atheist Alex O'Connor. Over the year, there were more than 2.5 million engagements with the series across six episodes on video, podcast, radio, print and online.



The popular **Ask NT Wright Anything** features renowned New Testament historian Tom Wright. Now in its weekly format, it saw over 2.5 million downloads during the year.



The new **C.S. Lewis Podcast** launched in April 2021 when theologian Alister McGrath came on the scene and this now has a loyal following.



In March 2022 a new podcast, **Matters of Life and Death** released its first episode to positive reviews, hosted by bioethicist John Wyatt and his son, journalist Tim Wyatt.

In May 2021 the **Unbelievable?** conference took place. Themed '*How to tell the greatest story ever told*' it featured NT Wright, historian Tom Holland and apologists Claire Williams, Sean McDowell among others. Due to continuing Covid restrictions the conference was only available online but attracted over 2,500 registrants from around the world, making it our best-attended conference ever.

In October 2021, **Unbelievable?** launched the Confident Christianity online course, which has already seen over 1,000 people enrol from all over the world. Also during the year, our team prepared to launch Faith Explored as well as the Unapologetic podcast, both part of the new ministry to people defend their faith and understand the concepts of theology, through our wide range of podcasts, video resources, live events, online courses and articles.

Since our telephone lines first opened 27 years ago, Premier Lifeline has answered over 1,675,000 calls. Besides providing emotional and spiritual insight from a Christian perspective, we also point callers to key services and support, and crucially offer to pray with each one, whatever their faith. 
Premier is incredibly grateful for the dedication of the 151 Lifeliners who gave, on average, over 161 hours each on our telephone lines during the year.

In turn, their support and the help they provide have been deeply valued and appreciated by the callers they've helped. Thanks to your gifts and

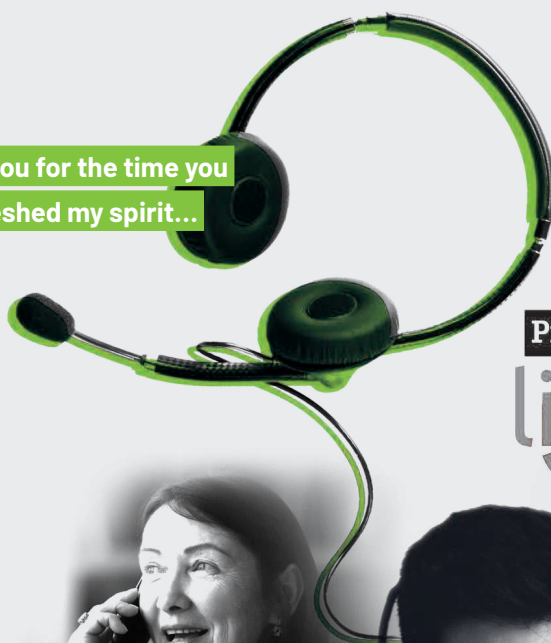
prayers, our Lifeliners have prayed with callers through a staggering number of requests on almost any topic imaginable.

All Lifeliners undertake extensive training and can take calls from home, allowing Lifeline to offer seamless support in people's time of crisis. GIVE GOD 5

Give God 5 invited people to spend five minutes a day focusing on God during the season of Lent 2022. Participants could choose from group, family or individual tasks and challenges, and each day of Lent received an email with a brief task or activity that could be completed within about five minutes.

Each week, a new theme kept people inspired on their spiritual journey and helped deepen their relationship with God. People were then invited to go back to the website to reflect, respond, share insights, and to see how others participants were getting on.

A downloadable workbook was also available to expand the tasks into broader activities on some days – and just under 2,000 people took part.

ADVENT MOMENTS

Day by day through Advent, from 28 November to Christmas, Advent Moments encouraged people to take a moment for God in the busy Advent season. In the approach to Christmas, we know people can get caught up in the expectations, the gift buying, meal planning, decorations, family and church events, parties and school commitments.

Advent reminds believers of the coming of Jesus into the world.

It is a time for us as Christians to focus on that life-giving message – so Advent Moments invited

believers to take a moment each day to prepare their hearts for the true meaning of this special time, to step away from the hubbub to reflect, to give, to pray and to spend time with God.

Premier sent daily emails to participants with a theme for each week (hope, joy, love and peace), as well as a Bible verse and question for reflection, and finally a short, simple activity to share the hope, love, joy and peace of the season with others.

Nearly 4,000 people joined in, sharing moments with family and friends.

FOUR NATIONS, ONE HOPE

People across the British Isles are connecting with God and one another.

Ian Britton, regional producer for the North of England, reported on one new programme that began during the pandemic but has continued ever since – Prayers of Hope. Every week, Premier invites around a dozen church leaders and believers from all over the UK to pray aloud with listeners on almost any topic under the sun. We encourage you to listen in every Sunday at 7pm, or catch up via our website.

Another inspiring way to have a far-reaching impact came from Mick Dewhirst, a Baptist minister and former rugby player from Skipton, North Yorkshire, known as the Gateway to the Dales. "I've developed a simple intercessory prayer using the 'front five' names I see in my Facebook feed (a term borrowed from the 'front five' forwards in rugby). I simply bring those first five names before God in my prayer time and post them on Facebook. The response has been overwhelmingly positive, making connections all over the world ... with one simple prayer:

"Lord, would you bless each one according to their need today. Amen."

Premier Christian Radio launches all-new Nations Days

Listeners to *Premier Christian Radio* and *Premier Praise* are spread far and wide across the four nations of the UK, listening to our stations via mobile apps, online or on DAB radios. The reach of Premier Radio is truly UK-wide, but perception at times has been that output has not always reflected and represented the footprint and people of the broadcast area. In November 2021 we celebrated our first Nations Day broadcasts focusing on Northern Ireland – and in February 2022, Scotland was in the spotlight with its own Nation Day of testimonies, music, interviews and other highlights.

From nation-specific interviews to musical artists, national ministries to local testimonies, the content each day shone as a regional light, which was further complemented with Sunday Night Live programmes also dedicated to each region. Stay tuned for other Nations Days coming up!

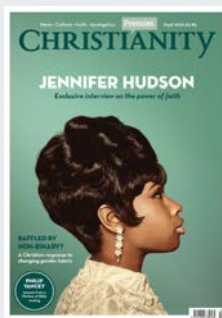

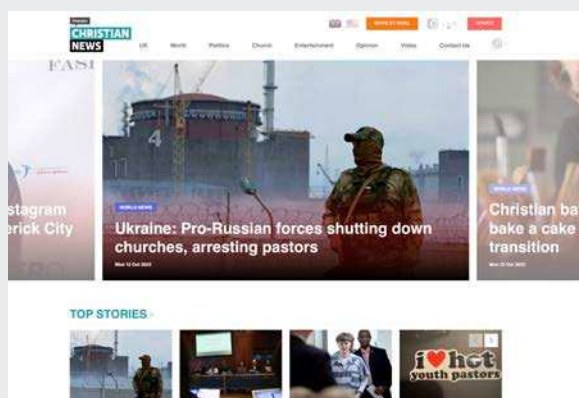

In 2021 Premier received word that our lease on Chapter Street would not be renewed, so we have been trusting God to help us find a permanent new home.

BEDARING

TRUSTING GOD FOR OUR FUTURE

Following the reluctance of our landlords to discuss terms of a new lease and their firm plans to redevelop the building, preparations for our departure from Premier's home near the heart of government became an important focus of work. The costs for moving were high, including locating and equipping temporary studios while a permanent home is secured.

And while the end of our time in Chapter Street felt like the 'perfect storm' of terrible events aligned against Premier's hopes and dreams, we saw in this God's amazing plans for the future of Premier to impact even more lives across the UK.

This comes at a time of huge uncertainty in the economy due to the war in Ukraine, but we truly believe that we are at a critical juncture in the spiritual battle for our nation. A note that Premier received from Elaine in Leicestershire says it all. She writes:

"Listening to Christian music through Premier, hearing the word of God read and praying has been such an encouragement to me, particularly during these times. We don't know what the future holds. But we do know who holds our future. Thank you, Premier for all you do to share God's hope to us all."

This is why we must not fail to meet this challenge *"to share God's hope to us all"*.

As Premier seeks God's leading to locate a permanent home, our goals for the future are unwavering:

- To establish a centre of excellence in Christian broadcasting.
- To address key issues facing the Church, including declining attendance, declining income and a lack of confidence in the gospel of Jesus Christ.

PREMIER REMAINS ON A GOOD FOOTING FINANCIALLY DESPITE CHALLENGES

A year of change

As Premier emerged from the pandemic, we, like other charities, faced continuing and evolving challenges. Throughout the year, Premier continued to provide its core services but was also driven to innovate, adapt and lead in new areas, in order to serve the needs of millions of people in the UK and increasingly overseas.

Today, Premier's users access our content through a wide range of traditional, digital and multi-media platforms, looking for inspiration, hope and spiritual nourishment in each one of our outlets. All the while, we continue to diversify and expand the ways that our users receive the

inspiration and comfort they find in the life-saving message of Jesus.

Our core fundraising revenues remained strong with only a 5% drop in total Fundraising revenues. Because generating commercial income can be challenging in uncertain times, we are especially grateful for the loyal support and goodwill from our diverse community of donors and we want to thank them wholeheartedly for their prayers and financial contributions.

Premier also faced higher operating costs as we rebuilt our team following the pandemic, resourced new digital services and to cover the exceptional costs of moving out of our central London offices.

Donations

The committed and often sacrificial support of Premier's donors is the lifeblood that enables the ministry to change lives across the nation.

It is humbling that through all the disruption, change and uncertainty of this year that so many people chose to become regular givers by setting up a monthly direct debit.

To give greater certainty in Premier's financial planning, our on-air fundraising appeals focused on regular giving for the first time.

Through this and other efforts overall the number of people with a regular gift increased by 1,128 people.

Online giving continued to rise during the year. The digital transformation of Premier's ministry continues to engage increasing numbers of people online, via podcasts and apps. This increased digital engagement brings new people into a giving relationship with Premier

and the development of support from the digital space will remain a priority for the longer term.

During the year Premier's Listener Support Team provided valuable opportunities for engagement with Premier. Their regular telephone contact encouraged thousands on a weekly basis.

Premier's support base is spread across eleven funding streams underpinned by our 34,000 active supporters. This diversity of support gives Premier added resilience in difficult times. As we look to navigate continuing disruption from the war in Ukraine, rising inflation and as we seek to secure a permanent home for Premier we will be looking to strategically develop these eleven streams to help us meet the increased needs of the times.

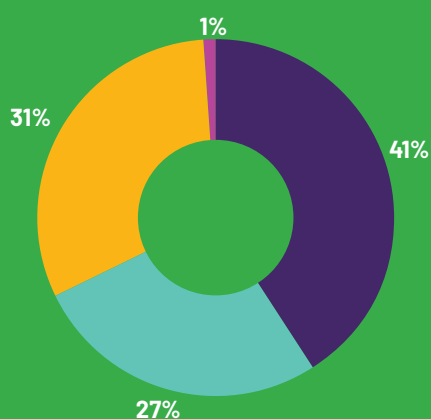

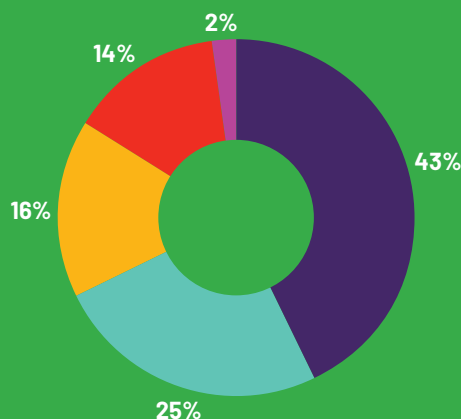


DONOR INCOME

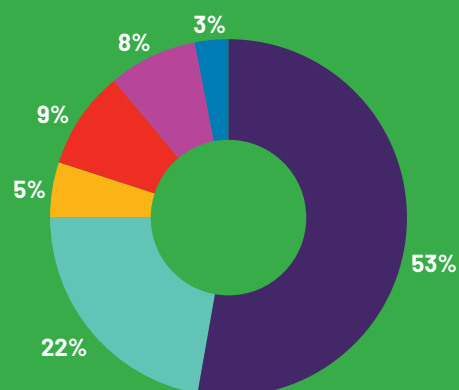


EXPENDITURE

Sales Revenue

Our e-commerce channels have seen positive year-on-year growth. Premier Jobsearch is now an established self-serve recruitment platform with many Christian organisations and ministries advertising their vacancies online, with upsells into our print publications.

Premier Christian Marketplace has doubled its stock lines over the past year, introducing faith-inspired products, books and Bibles for all age groups, successfully establishing itself as the 'go to' Christian on-line retailer. Garden of Eden Coffee is now stocked in Marketplace, promoted to both consumers and church communities, and by God's grace we hope to take this brand forward.

Direct sales had a challenging year with the after effects of Covid impacting consumer confidence. However, we were delighted to secure a major contract in the form of our 'Charity of the Year' partner, as well as successfully negotiating a three-year contract with a major charity who joined as Premier's International Mission Partner in 2022.

Commercial sources of revenue for Premier include direct income from advertising, sponsorship, magazine subscriptions, event tickets and ministry partnerships. Commercial relationships come from a broad range of wonderful charities, ministries and Christian organisations who recognise the unique reach that Premier has across all of its channels

including radio, print and web – as well as the potential to offer marketing opportunities through our digital products such as podcasts, social media and email lists.

Our commercial relationships have remained strong throughout the year by the grace of God, and we are truly thankful for the many dedicated and loyal advertisers and sponsors. We are pleased that revenue from sales and trading recovered and increased by 3% year on year.

The impact of the pandemic is still felt. Many of our advertising clients paused or cancelled their marketing spend and, combined with the cancellation of many in-person events, advertising incomes were well below our expectations. Consumer confidence began to slowly return in the latter part of the year and we are grateful that, despite the challenges the year brought, many of our long-standing clients remain loyal to Premier.

Legacies

Support through legacy gifts currently represents around just 1% of Premier's income but as we grow this support it will enable Premier to reach out in transformational ways above and beyond what our regular donation income will allow.

These gifts, however big or small, are vital to helping to secure the future for all those who need to hear the love of God, and we will always ensure we put them to the best possible use



to fuel the work of this ministry. The world will continue to change, and the ways people communicate and connect will continue to evolve over time, but whatever shape the media landscape takes in the future, it is vital Premier Christian Media Trust (287610) is there; knowing that Premier's legacy will never be fulfilled until every person has had the opportunity to hear the life-changing message of Jesus.

Trusts

A special thank you to the John Templeton Foundation with whom we have completed the second year of three-year award for The Big Conversation series available through *Premier Unbelievable?* This is enabling Premier to encourage more thought and conversation around why as Christians we believe what we believe. Since the launch of The Big Conversation in 2018, we have now completed three seasons. So far, this most recent season has generated over 2.7 million engagements across six episodes.

We were also grateful to receive the support of the Jerusalem Trust during the year. Receiving the final grant of a two-year award to fund our work to enable the church to thrive in the digital world. This project created over 400 educational videos and over 74,000 users accessed the website during the grant period.

Finally, the J W Laing Trust also provided a grant to help support the Unbelievable? conference, which for the first time took place entirely online. The event attracted 2,500 registrations, over three times more than had attended the in-person event before the pandemic.

Expenditure

Throughout the last year, Premier continued to prioritise the funding it received towards broadcast transmission, not only delivering quality content across its wide range of platforms, but also building the digital infrastructure and technologies needed to be effective and powerful in this digital age.

Demand for Premier's digital resources – including websites, podcasts and online listening – continued to grow. Premier increased expenditure to cover the people and technology resources required to deliver Premier's digital transformation programme.

Premier also incurred exceptional costs to cover the ending of the lease on our central London offices and moving to smaller and lower-cost premises. Although this move resulted in several material one-off costs, it will result in significantly lower office costs in future.

Premier always tries to achieve the best value for money it can with ongoing reviews of costs and budgets, and by continuously seeking out efficiencies that enable it do more, quicker, reaching further.

As we all continue to live through difficult times, there is no doubt that the last year has brought challenges to families in so many ways. Throughout this time, God has continued to sow seeds of hope into people's lives through Premier, bringing the reassurance that he is ever-present.

Premier will continue to resource and support people in their journey of faith and reach out to those who are seeking meaning and purpose for their lives.

This could be by supplying parents, or anyone nurturing and guiding children and young people, with the inspiration and resources they need through Premier NexGen.

It could be a word from God through any of Premier's radio stations 24/7, 365 days a year. It could be the prayer prayed by one of our Premier 'Lifeliners' with a caller who needed support and care in their time of need.

We are only limited by our own imaginations in understanding the ways in which God will use Premier to do his work. Remember, only Christians will support Christian ministry so please consider whether today you could have an impact on lives in the future.
